



Animal Vision Center (AVC) is located just north of Seattle in the city of Mountlake Terrace. We are conveniently located just off I-5 at Exit 177 (the I-5/Hwy 104 interchange) with easy access to I-5 and I-405.

From Interstate-5 South

Take I-5 south towards Seattle to Exit 177 (WA-104) towards Lake Forest Park/Kenmore. After exiting the highway, turn left onto 244th St SW/WA-104. Travel under the interstate and immediately get in to the far left lane (separated by the median). Turn left at the traffic light onto 244th St. SW. Stay in the left lane and turn left onto Gateway Place. Take the next right into the large parking lot and the clinic will be directly in front of you.

From Interstate-5 North

Take I-5 north towards Lynnwood to Exit 177 (WA-104) towards the Edmonds/Kingston Ferry. Stay in the left lane and turn left at the stop sign onto 244th St SW/WA-104. Turn left at the traffic light onto 244th St. SW. Stay in the left lane and turn left onto Gateway Place. Take the next right into the large parking lot and the clinic will be directly in front of you.
